Teacher Scholarships: What's Included and What's Not

Jump\$tart National Educator Conference teacher scholarships include:

- Conference registration and materials.
- Private hotel room at the Omni Louisville for the nights of November 2 and 3.

Credit or Debit Card Deposit

All participants will be asked for a \$100 deposit at the time of registration. This deposit is fully refundable provided you attend the full conference. Your deposit will be credited to the same credit or debit card that you provided, shortly after conclusion of the conference.

Travel Considerations

Jump\$tart does not control and cannot predict changes to travel-related rules and regulations. We encourage each conference attendee to make sure you understand your travel carrier's policies.

For teachers, your travel schedule must allow you to attend the full conference, as stipulated in your scholarship, so please plan travel accordingly. Dress for Success

Throughout the conference, school casual attire is recommended, with a couple of exceptions:

We started with just one school, Eastside College Prep in East Palo Alto, and from the beginning, we committed to making all NGPF services free, ensuring that cost would never be a barrier to learning. Today, more than 100,000 educators rely on the NGPF platform for their curriculum and professional development needs, all provided at no cost to educators. Thanks to our collective efforts, 26 states have now passed laws requiring a semester-long course in personal finance, covering 64% of high school students either currently or in the near future.
