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### The Hands on Banking Experience

Activity for high school students and young adults





A game-like simulation teaching money management concepts

- Each participant gets a profile with a career, income, and family scenario, and must make decisions about real-life expenses
- Participants get a taste of adulthood as they practice key financial skills:
  - Budgeting; making spending decisions within the constraints of a budget
  - Saving, short-term and long-term
  - Evaluating needs vs. wants
  - Comparison shopping
  - Making tradeoffs
  - Handling unexpected expenses

3 ways to play:

- 1. In person, where participants visit stations set up around the room
- 2. In person using a slide presentation
- 3. Virtually, using slides in an online meeting
